

## SHORT TERM OPPORTUNITIES FOR EDUCATORS

### SHARE EXPERTISE, DEVELOP PARTNERSHIPS, AND ENGAGE WITH COLLEAGUES ABROAD

Through the Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Short-Term Program, U.S. K-12 teachers and educators can apply for grants to engage in collaborative projects for 2-6 weeks abroad. Participants consult with and support schools, non-profit organizations, teacher training institutions, and other educational organizations abroad. The grant award funds travel costs, lodging, meals, local transportation, and related costs. These grants give U.S. educators flexibility to participate in the Fulbright Program while meeting their teaching and professional commitments.

#### ELIGIBILITY & APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- ❖ U.S. citizen currently residing in a U.S. state or territory
- ❖ Master's degree or enrolled in a Master's program
- ❖ Full time K-12 educator
- ❖ Spend at least 50% of time interacting with students in current position
- ❖ Alumni of other Fulbright Teacher Exchange Programs are eligible
